The property is situated 15 minutes by car from the central railway station and 40 minutes from the airport, inside a pedestrian area, where only authorized vehicles are allowed. Taxis and private drivers can get right in front of the main entrance. We recommend avoiding driving inside the center of Rome. Still, garage services are available nearby. There is an elevator, or 140 steps stairs to enter the property from the main gate entrance. The apartment is on the top floor, the fifth.

Location

The property is conveniently located right in the pedestrian area of Rome's city centre, making it a good fit for guests who want to be close to the heart of the action, this property is perfect for those who want to be near restaurants, bars, designer boutiques, and love living an authentic Italian experience

Overview



The apartment is located in Rome's most renowned residential neighbourhoods and near Piazza di Spagna, walking distance from all the main sightseeing, restaurants, bakeries, and designer's outlets. Inside, guests will find an airy ambient with great views of the rooftops of the Eternal City. The interiors include a spacious living room with a dining area, an eat-in well-equipped kitchen, one terrace with a dining table, another terrace with an external sofa area, and a view to Trinità dei Monti. 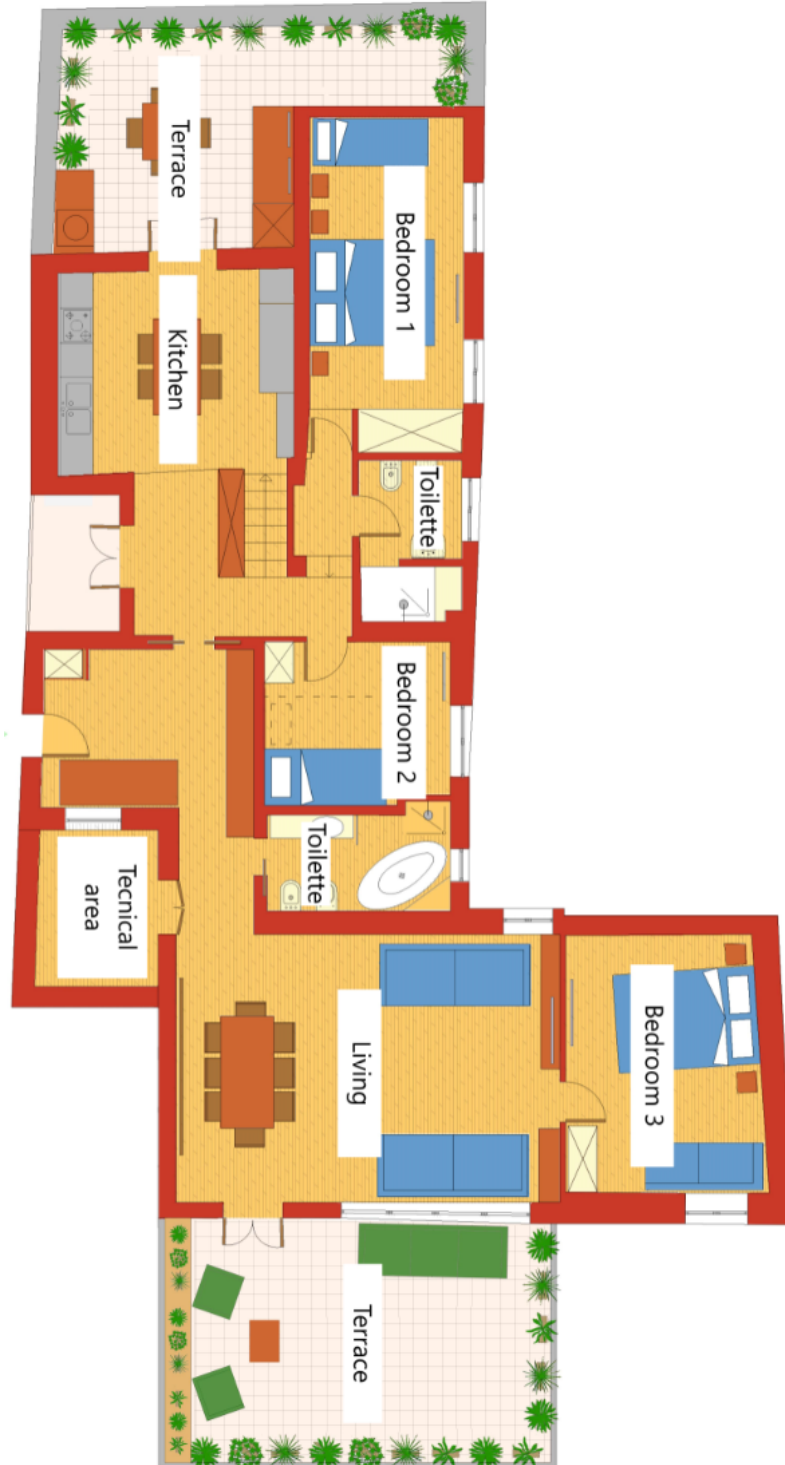

Experience



Rome has great energy that comes from mixing history with so many different people worldwide. And, as well as the restaurants, shopping, and nearby nature, people's perceptions are mesmerized from a culturally rich area of museums, architecture, and art. Several close-by restaurants serve organic, refined cuisine.

We recommend the traditional and famous [Hostaria da Pietro](#) with his arched exposed-stone ceilings; this place is a locally renowned osteria (tavern) between the Romans. It serves local specialties and a good range of grills, fish and truffle dishes, for those who prefer a local-chic atmosphere, the enchanting

As a lounge for wine tasting or aperitive, we recommend the [Strawinskiy](#) Bar at the Hotel De Russie, an oasis of relaxation in the historic city centre. This place is commonly the gathering spot for the city's bright and beautiful. It features an inner garden crowned by mature trees, fountains, and lush botanicals, lending it a certain splendour.

There's more to Rome's than, probably, to the rest of Italy: Rome, the Eternal City, has many more sights than anyone has time to visit and as the Italians say, "Roma, non basta una vita" (Rome, a lifetime is not enough), so even the most dedicated of native Romans is unlikely to have seen it all. Rome has many facets; however, we think there's an ancient Rome and a Baroque Rome, and they both are worth seeing with dedicated, themed itineraries. Rome is the place where the word 'Dolce Vita' was born - and not by accident: thousands of restaurants, casual places for aperitifs

and magnificent terraces by luxurious hotels with a full sight on the city, many shops and markets make of this place a unique destination in the world.

The Vatican City (the smallest country in the world), located in the very heart of [Rome](#), is the pulse of Catholic life. It attracts millions of pilgrims worldwide, who come every year to gather in prayer and seek the blessing of the Pope. A beloved destination for all those visitors attracted by the magnificent artworks in the Vatican Museums, its foremost monument is Peter Basilica the largest church on the globe, the imposing dome that stands regally over the rooftops of the Eternal City. Rome offers precious hidden gems like the Cloister of Bramante, one of the highest points of Renaissance architecture, situated adjacent to Santa Maria Della Pace church is home of Raphael's Sibyls and is a cultural center with a rich overturn of selected exhibitions of Art.

Notes: A heady mix of haunting ruins, awe-inspiring art, and vibrant street life, Italy's hot-blooded capital is one of the world's most romantic and charismatic cities in the world: Rome, the "Eternal City" reconstructs in one city the course of history. Rome is the main seat of State institutions, and we cannot forget its Piazza di Spagna, with the famous Spanish steps, Piazza Farnese and Piazza Navona with Bernini's Fountain, not to mention the 18th-Century Trevi Fountain, where tourists throw coins and express their wish to return to the Eternal City

- The first stop in the heart of Rome is the [Colosseum](#), where the gladiator games took place
- Via Dei Fori Imperiali leads along the most important archaeological itinerary, a unique set of temples, basilicas, public and sacred buildings and the [Roman Forum](#)
- [Capitoline Museums](#), on the Campidoglio, the acropolis of ancient Rome
- [Castel Sant'Angelo](#), the mausoleum for the Emperor Hadrian
- [Vatican City](#), the seat of the Papal State. Here we can admire the famous Piazza San Pietro, with the 16th-Century colonnade by Bernini and the magnificent Sistine Chapel
- Approximately 25 miles from Rome, the town of Tivoli demands a visit, given that it hosts two ancient, lavish estates: [Hadrian's Villa](#) and [Villa d'Este](#), both UNESCO World Heritage Sites.
